

### Research Data Management (RDM)

Max Weber Stiftung

- RDM describes all activities that occur along the so-called research data life cycle, beginning with the collection/creation of data, mainly concerns good documentation during the phase of data processing and extends to the archiving of research data.
- Research data should fulfil the FAIR principles right from the planning stage.

### Data Management Plan (DMP)

Max Weber Stiftung

- Funding for research is linked to the demand for sustainable data management based on so-called data management plans (DMP).
- A DMP is a formal document that outlines how data are to be handled both *during* a research project, and *after* the project is completed.
- It describes the (planned) collection, storage, processing and publication of data, as well as the necessary resources, legal framework and responsible persons.

A DMP thus contributes to the long-term findability, accessibility, interoperability
and reusability of data along the FAIR principles.

- Guidelines for Handling Research Data within the MWS<sup>1</sup>: procedures and responsibilities for the management of research data
- Data stewards: each institute has nominated at least one person that is responsible for RDM / regular meetings: at GHI Washington → Katharina Hering
- RDM Knowledge Base<sup>2</sup>: internal collection of relevant RDM themes (experience exchange, "train-the-trainer" principle)

#### Welcome to RDMO the Max Weber Foundation's central platform for data management RDMO (Research Data Management Organizer) is a tool that supports you in the structured planning of your data management and the creation of data management plans and text modules for your funding application. Through a structured interview in the form of a suitable questionnaire, the following are thereby · considers all important aspects of data management (such as responsibilities, data description, archiving and publication), · put collaborative data management on a common basis for agreements, · enables the output of a data management plan or individual text modules for your funding application, · versioned data management plans for your funding body (e.g., for EU Horizon 2020 projects) via snapshot function. Initial registration of research projects RDMO is also used for the initial recording of projects that are transferred in this context to the RDM workflow of the MWS, which includes an advisory service regarding IT infrastructure, software and data formats as well as data publication (repository, metadata, licences). The input mask of the questionnaire "MWS Projects - Initial Entry" also contains all fields required for the MWS project database, which are transferred to it via a corresponding export function. Detailed information can be found in our detailed instructions for project entry.



- You can create a DMP by clicking on "Create new project", entering a title and a short description and then clicking on "Answer questions".




#### The RDMO Platform of the MWS

The questionnaire is structured according to six main categories and several subcategories (see navigation on the right side).







### **OA Publication Platform perspectivia.net**

- Since 2008: digital Open Access publication platform perspectivia.net
- Since 2017: based on MyCoRe, operated together with VZG
- Publication type: mainly journals (data format: PDF/A, metadata format: MODS)

- Publication and presentation of digital collections of sources and editions
- Currently work in progress, see MWS Best Practice Handbook on RDM:

#### **Publication of Research Data**



- Open Access publication of Research Data
- Publication of Research Data that are permanently protected (or protected with an embargo deadline)
- Publication of Research Data that have to be deleted (after a period of 10 years or earlier)

#### **Publication of Research Data**




- In accordance with the RDM guidelines of the MWS, all researchers should make their data that
  are the basis of scholarly findings available in a suitable repository and use open and
  widespread licenses, assumed that this is legally possible.
- There are already several well-proofed and certified external repositories that can be recommended for the humanities.
- Information on this you can find in the Best Practice Handbook on RDM: <u>Datenpublikation</u>,
   <u>Empfohlene Forschungsdatenrepositorien</u> or by individual consulting
- Store only those RD in perspectivia.net for which no suitable external repository can be found
- Note: research data published in external repositories can be linked with a metadata entry in perspectivia.net, see MWS Best Practice Handbook on RDM: <u>Nachweis in perspectivia.net</u>

## Publication of Research Data in perspectivia.net

- Since 2023, some research data have also been published in perspectivia.net.
- Filtering by "Search & Browse" > "Genres" > "Research Data": 23 results





## Solutions for Sensitive or Restricted Research Data



- Even data that are not suitable for publication may receive a DOI and can thus be referenced and linked with metadata, see MWS Best Practice Handbook on RDM: Closed or restricted Access
- In principle, it is already possible to store restricted data in perspectivia.net
- Adaptations are necessary


## **Solutions for Sensitive or Restricted Research Data**

Currently, **technical adjustments** are ongoing:

- Revise and activate a webform for submission
- Define mandatory elements (e.g. "title", "author", "licence", "resource type", "description", etc.)
- Add missing elements (e.g. "related source", "data structure", etc.)

#### Workflow:

- General instructions in MWS Best Practice Handbook on RDM
- RDM data stewards carry out a first check and directly enter the metadata in perspectivia.net – they can also reserve a DOI before publication
- Data transfer will be organised in close cooperation of IT departments (central office and institute)
- Preview by editorial team at central office and final data check by the authors
- Publication in perspectivia.net

## Solutions for Sensitive or Restricted Research Data

- Sensitive data should be handed over to the central office of MWS at the latest after the end of the project.
- Thus, all data that may not be published for legal, political or ethical reasons get a
  DOI and will be findable (while not accessible for now).
- Researchers can register their requirements via RDMO

### **Special Case: personal data protection**



 Research data for which deletion is required after 10 years (if you do not say otherwise in the consent form!): Please, make sure to adapt the consent form!

- in-house archive solution (storage on slow storage media with a low backup frequency) and process for deletion after 10 years if required; more info here:
